Partners in Care VP of Health Services Accepted to Practice Change Leadership Program

Transforming Leadership in Aging Programs and Health Care Organizations

SAN FERNANDO, Calif. (Oct. 7, 2017) — Partners in Care Foundation (Partners), is pleased to announce that Anwar Zoueihid, Vice President of Health Services, was selected to participate in the sixth cohort of the Practice Change Leaders program.

This 2018 class of Practice Change Leaders for Aging and Health was identified from professionals who responded to a highly competitive nationwide call for applications. Mr. Zoueihid is one of only 10 leaders chosen to participate in the prestigious program, aimed at building leadership capacity among professionals who have a key role in a health care delivery organization, health-related institution, or community-based organization with direct responsibility for care that impacts older adults.

Through participation in the 14-month Practice Change Leaders program, awardees receive \$45,000 and the support of local and national mentors to further develop their leadership skills and to complete a project aimed at implementing a new geriatric service line or aging program. Complementing their development as individual leaders, the cohort will join a collegial network of dedicated professionals who share a commitment to improving health and health care outcomes in older adults.

Transitional leadership care is integral to shaping the future of health care. As part of the Practice Change Leaders program, Zoueihid will enrich the California Community Transitions program at Partners by focusing on adults who reside in high-level care facilities, such as nursing homes, and who are Medi-Cal or are dually eligible. The goals of this project strive to enhance quality of life for health plan members through social services and case management. Zoueihid oversees Partners' community health center programs and services that connect adults with specialty and primary care, housing, moving assistance, personal care services, mental health support, transportation, financial assistance, and much more.



"Health plans identify clients, verify their eligibility, conduct joint visits with us, and share information on our transitional care services," said Partners CEO, June Simmons. "When the client is interested in a transition, they receive a warm hand-off to one of our *transition coordinators* who works to return a nursing home patient back to the community—leadership is critical in providing holistic, individualized, and excellent patient care."
